

## **Airborne Photographer's ADIS Class Information**

Attendees to the Airborne Photographer's ADIS class on Saturday August 27, 2011 are requested to bring all photography equipment, user manuals and a laptop (Windows or Mac) preloaded with Google Earth and Nikon software Nikon ViewNX 2 (for GPS GP-1 compatible Nikon cameras including the Nikon D5000). The class will be over a two hour extended session from 1015 to 1215. Expect hands-on format to demonstrate camera settings necessary to perform single photos and wide area intervalometer capture. Changing weather conditions causing an update of camera settings will be included.

Put the ViewNX 2 link and the Transfer 2 link into your dock or desktop for ease of use. (Transfer 2 will load with ViewNX 2).
